# A Word from Nancy

"Whatever you do for any of my people, you do for me."

Matthew 25:40

Have you seen this on the back of the new Westminster T-shirts? In 2016, the denomination, PC(USA) committed to being a Matthew 25 Church. This meant being a church living in the ways called for by Matthew 25, most especially by the last part of that chapter (verses 31–46).

This article is just a brief explanation of what it means to be a Matthew 25 Church. The information is primarily being taken from the PC(USA) website. I invite you to visit that website and learn a great deal more about this initiative. Just Google PCUSA Matthew 25. You'll find loads of articles, explanations, and videos!

Donna Frischknecht Jackson, in an article in Presbyterians Today, wrote, "A wondrous change is taking place — a movement of the Spirit. Presbyterian congregations are reprioritizing the work of the Church, taking it from an institution of survival to a way of getting actively engaged in the community and making the world a better place."

We here at Westminster are among those PC(USA) congregations that are trying to get to the root causes that create an unjust world. As the Rev. Dr. Diane Moffett, president and executive director of the Presbyterian Mission Agency says, we see that "the love of God has skin on it." Moffett, a pastor herself, knows all too well that Presbyterians can make some of the best mission statements. The challenge, though, is to live them out."

The information on the website goes on to explain that Matthew 25 is not an initiative or program to spur numerical growth. It is simply an invitation to churches, big and small, to bring focus to and frame the work they're called to do. And, in the process, Matthew 25 invites Presbyterians of various theological and political views to stand on common ground together, strengthening the denomination to become "a more relevant presence in the world," Moffett says.

Matthew 25 has at its heart three main goals: building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty.

Congregational vitality is a lot more than filling the pews on Sunday mornings, the scope of the programs offered, or the size of the financial gifts. Congregational vitality is evident in a worshiping community when its structural systems, finances, and discipleship

practices are in line with the mission of Jesus. I see places at Westminster where we are attempting to aid our community: Bus Fare, Backpack Buddies, our work at the Community Kitchen, our work at Northwest Georgia Hunger Ministries, feeding the neighborhood children on Wednesday nights where we are trying to introduce them to the love of Jesus (without hammering it into them), and the nights we housed homeless people during the harshest of the winter nights. I applaud these efforts. Not only do they speak to congregational vitality, they also serve to aid our awareness of racism and poverty that exists in our own backdoor. But these missions require resources. And that's where we, as a congregation, come in.

But, here is where I am guilty. I have not vet attended a Bus Fare lunch. I have not brought food for the community food bank, nor have I helped pack or deliver backpack buddies. I bet I am not the only one. This is where we can all do better. If you have not signed up to help with Bus Fare, then do so. If you have not brought food for the pantry, do so. If you have not helped out at the Community Kitchen, sign up and do so. If you have not packed supplies for Backpack Buddies, see Sarah Whitley. You can do it!! And so can I!!

Then dream. Dream of how we can be a further presence in the lives of those who need us. What can we do for people and by so doing, do for Jesus?

# **'SHIPS**

Many of our Mission activities depend on partnerships.

The Community Pantry relies on food supplies we receive through partnership with Northwest Georgia Hunger Ministries and residents of The Spires.

Bus Fare is a collaboration with Rome-Floyd County Community Kitchen, William Davies Shelter, and Fork, Spoon, and Plate.

We will be working with YMCA of Rome & Floyd County and RCS School Nutrition for our Summer activity and lunch program for neighborhood children.

Bus Fare and our Summer program meet needs of some of our less-privileged neighbors. For many of us, this is our comfort zone - to do something for others. Partnerships allow us to do more than we might otherwise be able to do on our own.

Perhaps more important than serving others through these programs, we have the opportunity to step beyond our comfort zones and grow relationships with our neighbors. Only when we are in authentic relationships with our less-privileged neighbors can we begin to learn about the systems and structures that keep them less-privileged. *Understanding the obstacles our* neighbors face is critical to our ability to answer our Matthew 25 call to eradicate systemic poverty.
